

Artist tackles worth in work

Taking on the corporate culture is a new exhibition opening today at Deluge Contemporary Art.

Promotion by Danielle Hogan, delves into modern society's views on value and worth. The gala opening goes tonight from 7 to 10 p.m. at 636 Yates St.

Hogan is a visual artist, arts writer and instructor who was born in Fredericton and has lived in Victoria since 2002. She holds a diploma in graphic design from the New Brunswick College of Craft and Design, a bachelor of fine arts degree from the Emily Carr Institute in Vancouver and a master of fine arts degree from the University of Victoria. She

has also been an artist in residence at the Banff Centre for the Arts and her work is part of the Canada Council Arts Art-Bank collection.

The exhibition features two related bodies of work. The first is titled Value Added and consists of a series of inexpensive or mundane objects that have been painstakingly beaded, thereby posing as objects of greater worth. The second series, Quantities Are Limited, is made up of nine 24 by 29 inch acrylic sheet-mounted portraits that relate to the objects and ideas from Value Added.

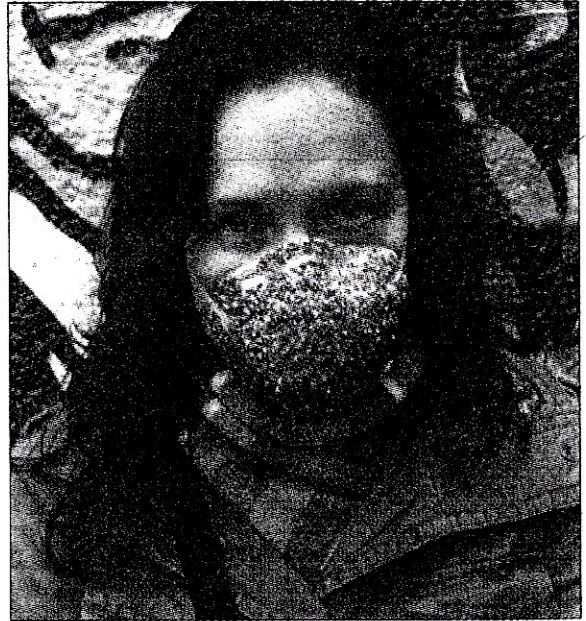
